Four wine glasses with feminist quotes and a jigsaw puzzle honoring women who fought for the vote.



Caste and a blank journal with a leather closure.



Colorfully painted, they were originally made with papier mache but nowadays they are also wood carved. The Alebrije was created by Pedro Linares Lopez in the 1930's." --Mexican Folk Art Guide website

Created with glass tile, stone, and pebbles and encased in a steel frame, this charming mosaic is ready to hang.

"A mosaic is an artistic technique that uses tiny parts to create a whole image or object. Mosaics are usually assembled using small tiles that are made of glass, stone, or other materials. ... Using this technique, artists place the tiles directly on the final surface, whether that be on a wall, table, or other objects."

This lovely scarf is 50% Merino wool and 50% Viscose. Wrap it around your neck. Wrap with tails on your chest. Wrap it like you saw in France.

Item 31Cross Stitch Cactus (5"x7") and Knitted Prayer Shawl, by and from Joyce Davison

There are those who don't sew, so exactly what is cross stitch? It's a stitch in which pairs of diagonal stitches of the same length cross each other in the middle to form an X. Pictures are created using this form of sewing. Patience is required, hence the cross-stitch mantra, "Proof I have the patience to stab something 10,000 times." – anonymous

Some prayer shawls are used by Christians to give comfort and spiritual strength to the sick, dying, poor or those suffering from bad fortune. They are a symbol of loving care and devotion. When making the shawl, the crafter is very intentional about her work and infuses the piece with a prayer.
